Wednesday May 31, 9.30-5.00

The seminar will focus on change and evolution in families, outlining how the therapy can 'fit' with the developmental process of the family to enhance the change process, which varies in its predictability.

- change as developmental process
- the role of therapy in this development
- the unpredictable and the deliberate in the change process
- chance and irreversibility.
- therapy as a 'nursing' process
- provoking difference in therapy

Thursday June 1, 9.30-5.00

The seminar will focus on the juxtaposing demands in therapy with sexually abused adults between developing accurate recollection, deconstructing the experience and the effects on the self, and the necessity for therapeutic compassion.

- repetitive abuse in the relationship in the therapy
- Time and Space in creating therapy as a holding environment
- the personal boundaries of the therapist in the therapy

Friday June 2, 9.30-5.00

The seminar will focus on the commonly presented themes in therapy with men, and the difficulties of making emotional connections with male clients and cultural stereotypic resistance of men seeking help.

- methods of engagement
- developing emotional maps both for the client's life and the therapy process.
- use of both personal and classical mythology in the therapy agenda
- dreamwork, and other avenues to unconscious life

Dr. Paul Gibney is a remarkably inspiring, entertaining speaker and trainer who combines an vast knowledge of theory and an irreverent independence of thought to teach psychotherapy in engaging, humourous and innovative ways.
