NOTES TO CONTRIBUTORS

- 1. Manuscripts should be typewritten on one side only on A4 paper, with double spacing and wide margins. Three hard copies should be submitted, and the approximate number of words stated. Material must also be submitted on diskette (5.25 or 3.5).
- 2. References should be referred to in the text by giving, in brackets, the surname of the author and should be listed in alphabetical order at the end of the article as follows:

BOOKS:

Author's name and initials; year of publication in brackets; title of book (in italics); publisher; page reference if appropriate.

ARTICLES:

Author's name and initials; date of publication in brackets; title of article; abbreviated title of journal (in italics); volume and number.

- 3. Footnotes should be kept to a minimum.
- 4. Each article should be prefaced with a brief resume.
- 5. Contributors are invited to submit a brief biographical note and a current photograph suitable for printing.
- 6. All manuscripts submitted will be reviewed by three referees. Manuscripts may be accepted for publication, returned for revision or rejected. The Editor's decision is final.
