

Child abuse and child protection

A guide for health, education and welfare workers

The introduction of mandatory reporting has meant that pressures on nurses, teachers, social workers, doctors and others whose work brings them into contact with children have never been greater. Yet there has been little Australian material available for these health, education and welfare professionals.

The first part of this book provides information for practitioners and students on the changes that brought about the discovery of child abuse and neglect, how child abuse is defined, the size of the problem, and its causes and effects. The second part seeks to assist workers in responding to the problem by examining reporting laws, and by offering practical advice on making referrals, working with families and children, assessments, case conferences and appearing in court. Dr Chris Goddard, Associate Professor Social Work at Monash University, worked several years at the Royal Children's Hosp in Melbourne, where he assisted in establishment of the child protection team. has written widely on the subject of cl abuse and child protection in professio journals and the broader media.
