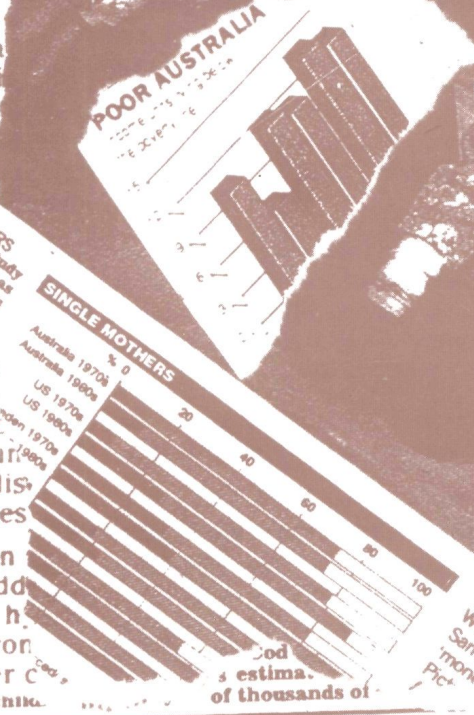

Millions living in poverty: report

...More than 2 million Australians lived in poverty in 1990, after they had paid their housing costs, a major report on social welfare has found. They included almost half of all single-parent families, a quarter of all households younger than 24 years and a quarter of all households with children aged 13,000 homeless people were sheltered in supported accommodation.



...cases of child abuse and neglect were reported in 1990-91. Mr. Howe said the increasing number of problems in the report, presented a new system but should be put in perspective.
